# Celebration of Pioneer Families

Awards & Annual Dinner, May 22 6:00 p.m., Lansing Center Governor's Room, 2nd Floor Sponsored by Wolverine Development


In the past eighteen months, we have collected exciting information about our pioneer families. Through our Family History Project, we have received rare records, photos, and narratives of nearly 50 families, families who have lived in the Greater Lansing area for at least 100 years. Five of the families can verify 160 years.

The oldest families carry such names as North, Barnes, Potter, Rose, and Gibson. Other older names include Turner, Dell, Stebbins, Whitman, Weaver, Dean, Pollok, Carpenter, McKeough, Hamilton, and Shipp.

The material from all of the families is being indexed by Rick Cantwell. To date, he has indexed over 1200 names, with birth, death, and marriage dates indicated. The material also includes invaluable property records. All will be made available for viewing and research at the Local History Room, Lansing Library.

On Thursday, May 22, at the Annual Dinner, Mayor David H. Hollister will award certificates to representatives of the families who have lived here for 100 and 125 years. In honor of Lansing's Sesquicentennial, special recognition will go to those who have lived here 150 years or more.

### Celebrate the Sesquicentennial!

This year, Lansing is celebrating 150 years, all of it as the Capital City of Michigan. Between now and January 1998, you will find publications, speakers, exhibits, and several activities, such as walking tours, the Michigan Parade, the Sesquicentennial Birthday Party, Vintage Base Ball, and a New Year's Eve costume party. We are co-sponsoring many of these events.

On March 18, the Opening Gala of the Sesquicentennial was attended by 400 people and broadcast by MGTV. The March 20 program, "The Race to the Capital," by Jerry Lawler, brought out 100. And on April 12, many roamed the Rotunda of the Michigan Historical Center to hear speakers and see displays and rare maps and documents reated to Lansing history.

The Sesquicentennial brochure, with a Calendar of Events and a Timeline of Lansing: The First 50 Years, is being distributed widely. Printing was donated by the John Henry Co., and HSGL members Harry Blanchard, Dave Caterino, John Curry, Jerry Lawler, Linda Peckham, Craig Whitford – and others – worked on the Timeline.

The television spots, "Lansing Stories," should begin soon on WLNS, Channel 6. These have been generously managed by HSGL Trustee Mark Ducker, assisted by members Rick Cantwell, Dave Caterino, Jerry Lawler, Jane McClary, Linda Peckham, Jacquie Sewell, and Martha Taylor.


