Pioneer Ghost Walk

Wednesday, September 17, 1997 6:30 p.m. Mount Hope Cemetery

When Mount Hope Cemetery opened in 1874, it was Lansing's fourth public cemetery. A few burials after 1845, had taken place in an earlier burial ground at the northeast corner of Turner and Franklin (Grand River Avenue). After 1848, burials were made on land the state had given to the new town on Saginaw near Larch. Only a few burials were made before the site also was abandoned.

In 1851 James and Horatio Seymore sold 20 acres to the town for a cemetery on Saginaw closer to Pennsylvania, the site of the present Oak Park. This cemetery was used until 1874.

In 1873, the city purchased the 80-acre Miller Farm at Mount Hope and Aurelius Roads for a larger cemetery, and from 1874-1881 nearly 1100 bodies were moved from Oak Park Cemetery to Mount Hope Cemetery.

Mt. Hope is a beautiful rolling cemetery above Sycamore creek. As you walk, watch for typical monuments with willow trees, symbols of death; unusual monuments, such as stumps of the Longstreet family or the dog on his master's grave; and the special monument to the Unknown Firemen (C110), a red call box.

Mt Hope Cemetery owes its developed beauty to H. Lee Bancroft, Supervisor of Parks and Recreation from 1914-1957, who established the plans for the landscaping and maintenance of all of the parks and cemeteries in Lansing. Join us on September 17th! By LINDA PECKHAM
