Strand Theatre Opens Thursday

Lansing's New Playhouse Will Be Thrown Open to Public Tomorrow

After several postponements, tomorrow night will make the grand opening of W. S. Butterfield's magnificent Strand Theatre and Arcade. Marking an innovation in luxuriousness and practical utility, the structure is attracting wide attention among theatrical men, builders, and the general public. Two shows will be given on Thursday evening. There will be a matinee on Friday and Saturday afternoons and two shows in the evening. A new bill will be presented on Sunday when three shows will be given and at that time the house will settle down into its regular polley (*sic.*) of one afternoon show and one evening show with the exception of Saturdays, Sundays and holidays.

Interior Is Beautiful

No theatre in Michigan will excel the Strand for appointments. Seating 2,000, the playhouse is the last word in modern fireproof construction. It is built entirely of concrete and steel and art tile. The stage is one of the largest in the state. The Arcade finished in the warm, brilliant colorings of Southern Spain forms a 165 foot approach to the grand foyer two-story affair constructed of Kane stone. The upper portion of the foyer is given over to a most artistic promenade leading to the mezzanine floor and balcony. A children's room with a colored maid in constant attendance is one of the modern features of the playhouse.

Arcade Is Feature

The Arcade is studded with 14 shops. The Washington Avenue street front contains other stores while the basement is devoted to a commodious recreation hall. Washed air forced through gigantic ducts supplies adequate ventilation to the basement as well as the theatre proper. In addition to a number of offices on the second floor is one of the largest convention halls and ball rooms in the middle west. This half is 165 feet long by 65 feet in width and is equipped with a practical stage. For banquet purposes the hall has equipment complete to the smallest detail with modern kitchens in connection. The Strand-Arcade has a frontage of [unreadable] feet on Washington ave and runs through to Grand ave, a distance of 330 feet.

Keith Vaudeville

Keith Vaudeville will be offered at the new playhouse. Six acts and pictures will make up the various bills. Because of the size of the theatre and class of attractions to be offered by two performances will be given daily from Monday to Friday inclusive. The matinee will start at 2:30 and the night show at 8:15. On Saturday and Sunday three shows will be the rule with one matinee and two night performances starting at seven o'clock and nine o'clock.
