The following expenditures were approved by email: \$400 for Board of Directors insurance from the General Fund; \$256 for wood for the exhibit cases from the Museum Fund.

Exhibits

The Lansing Votes exhibit will include a series of four brown bag lunches in the City Hall lobby at noon on the first four Wednesdays in April. Karen Douglas will present on the Morlok Quads on April 2; Maureen Hirten and Val Marvin will present on the Carnegie Library on April 9; David Hollister will present on the "Keep GM" initiative on April 16; Jo Crego Hacker will present on her memories of her father, Mayor Crego, on April 23. The tear down date for the Lansing Votes exhibit will be April 30 and a new exhibit will go up one month later.

A program on the Sparty statue and sculptor Leonard Jungwirth will be presented on April 3 at 7:00 pm in City Hall. The evening will include a short talk on his career, as well as the very rare chance to see the original maquette of Sparty.

The Made in Lansing exhibit is moving forward with weekly work sessions scheduled and set-up dates on May 1 and 2. It was moved by Joan and seconded by Anne to approve up to \$500 for exhibit costs from the Museum Fund. Motion approved. Val announced that we will also have part of the Made in Lansing exhibit in the RE Olds Museum. It will include the automotive and auto related items from the exhibit. The RE Olds Museum has agreed to give our members their tour at 50% of the regular cost (\$3 instead of \$6) and they will put their curved dash in City Hall as part of the exhibit.
